

# Safe Return to School Fall 2021 As of August 10, 2021

DC West Community Schools' completed a year of school for all students, every day, all day last year. For another year of success with in-school learning, we will need the valued DC West Falcon partnership between school and home to continue.

We stand behind our district mission and are prepared to educate our students in a safe environment.

Douglas County West Community Schools creates passionate learners by maximizing student achievement through dynamic learning experiences which inspire and provide a quality education for all students within a safe and community-supported environment.

We continue working closely with our state and local health officials. We have developed enhanced health and safety precautions to protect our students and staff. We have also developed an instructional plan that supports our belief that the best educational option for students is to be in our schools with our teachers. We know this has and continues to be a very difficult time and understand there will be individual situations and circumstances. We will work with families to address those situations. We will continue to collaborate with health professionals to monitor and adjust our plans moving forward.

The DC West Safe Return to School document outlines plans we will implement in response to the COVID-19 pandemic for the 2021-22 school year. It is understood that circumstances could remain fluid and may change as the year progresses. Final decisions will be dependent upon guidance and requirements from state and local officials.

#### DC West Belief Statements Related to the Pandemic

- Students can learn and develop through successful experiences.
- Students will be provided educational opportunities that challenge him/her to meet his/her full potential.
- The district is accountable to the community for student performance and fiscal responsibility.
- Physical and emotional safety is essential for learning.
- A positive learning and teaching environment can be created through courtesy and mutual respect for the dignity of every person.
- The educational process should prepare students to live with and affect change.
- Students, parents and teachers share the responsibility for learning.
- Public education is the responsibility of the entire community.

#### **Attendance Level Definitions**

Multiple factors will be used to assist in determining the school district's attendance level of green, yellow, orange, or red. These factors include, but are not limited to:

- Recommendations from state and local officials
- Current DC West school district or building positive COVID case counts of staff and students
- Data from the <u>Douglas County COVID Dashboard</u> indicating risk associated with DC West Zip Codes
- <u>Sarpy/Cass County Health Department</u> and <u>Three Rivers Public Health Department</u> Dashboards (surrounding counties' information)

DC West is planning for four attendance level scenarios. We will have leading indicators if we have a need to move to a different attendance level. We will establish communication and have ample time for the transition to occur.

#### **GREEN Level**

All students in school, every day, all day. The district follows the traditional school-day and school-year calendar. The school day looks normal with the choice of individual enhanced safety precautions such as masking. Details of these precautions are included in this document. Bussing, lunch, and after-school programming will continue but will look normal. Some physical distancing and safety measures will be in place.

#### YELLOW Level

All students in school, every day, all day. The district follows the traditional school-day and school-year calendar. The school day looks normal with the addition of enhanced safety precautions, possibly required, to keep our students and staff safe and healthy. Details of these precautions are included in this document. Bussing, lunch, and after-school programming will continue but will look different with specific safety guidelines. Numerous physical distancing guidelines and safety measures will be in place.

#### **ORANGE Level (Blended Model)**

This model allows for students to receive face-to-face instruction while reducing the number of students in classrooms and allowing for more physical distancing. Numerous physical distancing guidelines and safety measures will be in place. The district follows the traditional school-year calendar. The student population will attend school and eLearning. Specific student attendance is outlined below.

- Preschool through 5th grade students attend school with a traditional schedule Monday Friday (regular Friday early release) and will remain with students in their homeroom classroom all day. Students will have no transitions to specials as these teachers will come to the students.
- 6th-12th grade students will receive face to face instruction at school two times a week and online live instruction at home two times a week. The same family/residence will attend school on the same day.

#### 6th-12th Student Last Name A-L:

- M & W: Attend school
- T & Th: Online live learning and work completion at home via Zoom according to their class daily schedule
- F: Independent learning at home. Online live reteaching with individual students.

#### 6th-12th Student Last Name M-Z

- M & W: Online live learning and work completion at home via Zoom according to their class daily schedule
- T & Th: Attend school
- F: Independent learning at home. Online live reteaching with individual students.

#### **RED Level (eLearning Model)**

The district follows the traditional school-year calendar. Staff may or may not be required to be on campus. The virtual eLearning Model will provide direct, video instruction, and social interaction between teachers and students. Students will engage with their teachers online on a daily basis. Teachers will deliver all instruction virtually for all students which will include real-time instruction and independent learning from home. Technology devices will be checked out to students and hotspots will be available upon request from families. The district will also establish a modified schedule for the eLearning Model school day.

#### **Student and Staff Attendance**

- Students/staff should stay home when exhibiting **two** of the following symptoms: fever, chills, aches, headache, sore throat, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea **OR at least one** of the following symptoms: sudden onset of cough, sudden onset of shortness of breath, or sudden loss of taste and/or smell.
- Douglas County Health Department and DC West Community Schools recommend contacting your physician or getting tested for COVID-19 if the symptoms appear and persist.
- If the student/staff or anyone in the household has been asked to isolate with COVID-19, please contact the school immediately.
- If anyone in the student's/staff's home has been diagnosed with COVID-19, they should contact the school, isolate or quarantine as directed, and those absences will be excused. If students are exposed, yet healthy enough to attend, they will be asked to self monitor and isolate if symptoms present.
- The district will follow all Douglas County Health Department guidance on staff and student recommended isolations and quarantines and those will be counted as an excused absence.

#### **Response to Positive COVID-19 Cases**

When a positive COVID-19 case is confirmed in a school, that individual will be isolated and allowed to return based upon current guidance from the Douglas County Health Department at the time. Health Department epidemiologists will work with schools to consider the following questions when determining how that case will impact others in their classroom and/or school building by assessing the following:

- What is the level of community spread outside the school building?
- Was the individual with COVID-19 wearing a mask most of the time?
- Were other students or staff who were within 3 feet of the individual with COVID-19 for more than 15 minutes masked?
- Was the individual with COVID-19 part of a cohort within the building or did they interact with a large number of students and staff throughout their day?
- To what extent is the school community implementing other non-pharmaceutical interventions (hand washing, hand sanitizers, etc.)

The answers to these questions will determine:

- The number of close contacts
- The number of other students and staff who will need to self monitor or mask

The school or school district will then communicate with families and staff accordingly. Communication will balance the privacy of individual students or staff and the need for information by others.



#### **Novel Coronavirus: Schools Guidance**

Updated July 7, 2021

#### **Purpose of Guidance:**

The purpose of this document is to provide guidance for schools in Nebraska. These recommendations are intended for school staff and administrators responsible for educating school-aged individuals.

#### **Guidance:**

For school aged individuals who have had close contact with a person(s) whom has developed or during the 48 hours prior to the person developing one or more of the following symptoms: sudden onset of cough, sudden onset of shortness of breath or sudden loss of taste or smell; or whom has developed or during the 48 hours prior to the person developing two or more of the following symptoms: a fever of 100.4 or above, chills, muscle aches, headache, sore throat, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea or fatigue or with a person whom has tested positive for COVID-19 whichever event occurs earlier, may meet the following conditions in lieu of quarantine:

 Self-monitor daily for fever or other symptom (listed above) development for 14 days and have NO symptom development.

If symptom development occurs within the 14 day self-monitoring need to follow isolation guidance.

Isolation shall continue until:

- At least ten (10) days\* have passed since onset of symptoms AND
- Symptoms have improved AND
- The isolated individual has been fever-free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication
   \*For patients with severe illness or are severely immunocompromised, this length of time may need to be
   extended. Please consult your health care provider or local health department for further guidance on these
   situations.

For individuals who tested positive for COVID-19 and do NOT have symptoms may discontinue isolation under the following conditions:

- At least ten (10) days have passed since the date of their 1st positive test AND
- Have had no symptom development AND
- For 3 days following discontinuation of isolation, these people must continue to limit contact and when
  possible wear a face covering.

# School Aged Individuals Self-Monitoring and Quarantine and Isolation Directions FAQs

Updated July 7, 2021

Q: If my school-aged individual is in extracurricular activities but has been exposed, can they participate in those extracurricular activities?

A: Yes, the school aged individual may participate in extracurricular activities as long as they are following the self-monitoring requirements.

Q: If my school-aged individual has a part-time job but has been exposed, can they still attend work?

A: Yes, the school aged individual may attend work as long as they are following the self-monitoring requirements. All worksite policies (including healthcare workers) need to be followed by the exposed individual including notifying the worksite of the exposure.

Q: Does my child need to wear a mask at outdoor recess?

A: No, the risk of transmission of SARS-CoV-2 in an outdoor setting is low.
