- 10 MacBook Air computers are teacher machines and will replace a few needed machines and accommodate new staff coming into the district. The 10 Apple Pencils will also be used for this reason.
- 50 MacBook Airs to replace the computer labs in the Middle/High School that are aged. Both of these labs will transition to mobile carts to be used in the middle/high school classrooms for multiple courses. The two lab classrooms will transition to middle/high school classrooms for the coming year.

These purchases are within the general technology budget for fiscal year 2022.

Daily Sub Pay increase from \$145/day to \$170/day Long Term Sub Pay increase from \$155/day to \$180/day
